

# CIOB LEVEL 4 DIPLOMA IN SITE MANAGEMENT

Fully funded by CWIC if you are employed or self-employed within the construction industry

This Level 4 CIOB qualification is an ideal progression route into Higher Education. You can increase your knowledge and achieve a Level 4 qualification, or use the course as a bridging qualification onto level 5, 6 and beyond.

If you are looking for a career in architecture, local authority planning, building control or teaching, or if you are involved with managing aspects of a project, either new build or renovation / restoration / maintenance work, planning, managing external trades, managing the ordering and delivery of materials, then this is the course for you.

The Site Management course provides the underpinning knowledge for the S/NVO Level 6 Diploma in Construction Site Management and is designed to meet the needs of those employed in, or training for site management.

Successful completion will:

- provide a Level 4 Supervisory Qualification
- enable individuals to apply for the CSCS Black Card
- with additional credits, allow individuals to progress onto the second year of the HNC (Higher National Certificate) qualification.

Units covered:

1. Managing Health, Safety, Welfare and Risk Control within a Construction Site - assessment set by CIOB
2. Contractual and Legal Responsibilities within a Construction Environment
3. Estimating and Measuring Work within a Construction Environment
4. Managing Technology of Modern Construction

Entry Requirements:

A level 3 qualification in any craft occupation eg. Bricklaying, Carpentry, Plumbing, Electrical or Painting. Also applicable to experienced workers, previous management experience would be crucial. An understanding of the Health and Safety requirements within Construction is advantageous.
